DISCOVER THE PAST THAT DESTROYED THEIR FUTURE

NISKAYUNA HIGH SCHOOL FILMMAKER LAUNCHES PREQUEL TO HIS POPULAR INDIE WEB-SERIES, OPUS 12



Filmmaker Jad Jacob, best known for his serialized drama, Opus 12, has created a new

movie set in the same universe, telling the tale of how the Opus Academy came to be, 15 yearsbefore the events of his initial indie web series.

Belwatch stars Josh Powell and Matt Mitchell as Julius Jackson and Richard Malvin, two

great minds who slowly turn from friends to enemies as the politics of their community dissolve around them. The prequel has many clear tie-ins to the series: Julius Jackson is the father of Opus12's protagonist, Vincent Jackson (Ethan Schalekamp); Richard Malvin is better known in the future as Dr. Malvin (Stephen Honicki), the sinister and elusive Head of the Opus Academy, who tries to defy Vince and the students' rebellion at every turn.

Unlike Opus 12, which is filled with comedic characters, light-hearted romance, and many

familiar aspects of teenage angst, Belwatch takes a notably darker, more "mature" tone. The characters are about a decade older than their Opus counterparts, and rather than a comedy-slashdrama-slash-coming-of-age-story, the prequel movie is best classified as a political thriller.

Each of the seven characters in Belwatch (as opposed to the thirty characters in Opus 12) hasan important part to play in the story of how the Opus comes to be. When Vendla Caesar (Maria Andreoli) is mysteriously killed at a rally, the committee she was a part of must elect a new Head Chief of their small safe-zone community, Belwatch. To Richard Malvin's dismay, the committee votes for Julius to replace Vendla instead of him. This event is the first of many political moves attempted by Malvin and the mysterious New World Safety Association, or NWSA, in their attempts to seize power at Belwatch. Siblings Esther and Octavian Crane (Mia Badalucco, Alex White) take opposite sides on the committee when it comes to finding new ideas to help improve Belwatch; Julius' best friend Marcus Nero (Tyshawn Fennell) finds internal conflict in standing with Julius, as Julius continues to stand

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closer and closer to Malvin—whose ulterior motives remain unrecognized by the committee, and the audience, until the final act. Meanwhile, Julius' relationship with Celine Roberts (Sam Sanborn) flowers over the course of the film, as their romanticism echoes that of their future children at the Opus. Meanwhile, Malvin looks on with intent at Julius and his plans...

With a shocking twist ending and tons of questions to be asked even after the credits roll,





Belwatch is a film best watched twice, and with an open mind both times. The story of how the Opus Academy came to be is not necessarily the one that Opus 12 fans would expect, yet it is the compelling story that creator Jad Jacob had planned out all along. Jacob has even dropped multiple hints as to the plot and secrets of Belwatch in the series finale of Opus 12; blink and you'll miss it, but the seeds of the prequel film had been planted into the series months before filming even began.

With a true passion for the arts, Jad Jacob has

spent his whole life playing piano and drums: composing original music to score his films; and acting, singing, and dancing in school plays and musicals with the Music program and Drama Club (This year he is the co-President!). His interest in the written work has provided opportunities to write within a variety of different genres - from scripts, to plays, to musicals, to self-publishing a book of poetry at age nine and completing a 70,000-word novel entitled Forgotten, which he later condensed into a five-minute short film he produced at a film summer camp at the College of St. Rose. Jacob hopes to continue studying film (as well as music) in college.




